
## **Business Spotlight: Camp Osprey**

This is something special. Connected business lends itself to a connected community.



# Cooking with Cookie

## **Dinner Entrees for May**

I'm always looking for new dinner ideas especially for the entree. Here are some that you might like to try in May.

#### Pork Saltimbocca with Peas (pictured at right)

4 boneless center-cut pork chops Kosher salt

3 Tbsp. olive oil

1/2 cup flour

1 large shallot, finely chopped

8 fresh sage leaves

1/2 cup dry white wine

1 1/2 cups chicken broth

5 thin slices prosciutto, 1 slice chopped

1 cup grated fontina cheese 1/4 cup grated Parmesan cheese

1 10-oz. pkg. frozen peas

Preheat broiler. Season pork chops with salt. Heat 2 tablespoons olive oil in large oven proof skillet over medium-high heat. Dredge pork in flour and add to the skillet; reserve excess flour. Cook until browned. Transfer to a plate. Reduce heat to medium; add shallot to skillet and cook, stirring until soft. Increase heat to medium high. Add sage and 2 teaspoons of the reserved flour. Cook until sizzling. Add wine. Cook until reduced by half. Add 1 cup broth; return to boil and cook until thickened. Add pork; return to simmer. Top each chop with a prosciutto slice and then cheeses. Broil until bubbling. Heat remaining 1 tablespoon oil in saucepan over medium heat. Add the chopped prosciutto and cook until crisp. Add the peas, remaining 1/4 cup broth and 1/4 teaspoon salt. Cover and cook until peas are tender. Uncover and increase heat to medium high. Cook until liquid is reduced. Serve with the pork.

Yield: 4 servings.

#### **Baked Lemon Chicken**

One 3 1/2-pound chicken, cut into pieces of 8 or 6 chicken breasts Kosher salt

Freshly ground pepper Flour for dredging

3 Tbsp. olive oil

1 large onion, sliced

Peel of half a lemon (pith removed) cut into thin strips


2 large garlic cloves, minced

1 1/2 tsp. fresh rosemary leaves

1 Tbsp. honey

1/4 cup freshly squeezed lemon juice 1 cup chicken broth

Preheat oven to 400 degrees F. Season chicken with salt and pepper. your cocktail). Dredge in flour and pat off excess.



Heat 2 tablespoons oil in large skillet. Add chicken and saute until golden brown. Remove chicken from skillet and reserve. Discard oil and wipe pan out. Add remaining 1 tablespoon oil and heat over medium-low heat. Add onion and cook until golden. Add lemon zest, garlic and rosemary and cook for 2 minutes. Add honey, lemon juice and broth. Increase heat and bring to a simmer. Transfer onions to 9" x 13" casserole and spread them. Arrange the chicken in a single layer on the onions. Pour the cooking liquid over chicken. Season with salt and pepper. Bake about 45 minutes. Remove from oven and serve. Yield: 4 servings.

#### **Sweet and Sour Meatballs**

1 can (20 oz.) unsweetened pineapple chunks

1 pkg. (12-oz.) frozen fully cooked meatballs, thawed

1 large green pepper, cut into 1-inch strips

3 Tbsp. cornstarch

1/3 cup cold water

3 Tbsp. cider vinegar

1 Tbsp. soy sauce

1/2 cup packed brown sugar Hot cooked rice

Thinly sliced green onions (garnish)

Drain pineapple, reserving juice. Set pineapple aside. Add enough water to juice to measure 1 cup. In large skillet over medium heat, cook the meatballs, green pepper and juice mixture until heated through. In a small bowl, combine the cornstarch, cold water, vinegar and soy sauce until smooth. Add brown sugar and pineapple to the pan; stir in the cornstarch mixture. Bring to a boil; cook and stir until thickened. Serve with rice and top with green onions. Yield: 6 servings.

Cooking Tip: Give pickle juice a second life. You can do this: Make more pickled veggies (bring the brine to a boil and pour over onions, cucumbers, carrots, radishes, or green beans; A better Bloody Mary: (stir tablespoon of pickle juice into

## **Bad Schandau &** The Czech Republic A cruise on the Elbe River

Saxon Switerland National Park and the Basteri Bridge, Saxony, Germany.

This morning with heavy hearts, and even heavier baggage, we leave the good ship "River Allegro", which has been our home for the last seven days, board the buses and depart Dresden for Bad Schandau. The crew is lined up on the sundeck to wave goodbye. They seem just a little too happy to see us go! I'm wondering what's in store for the people who will be boarding the ship this evening for the trip down river. With the river so low, they may have to be bused much of the way; not what they expected when they booked a river cruise!

We are heading for an area known as "Saxon Switzerland" so named by early settlers because of its topographical resemblance to their homeland of Switzerland. It is one of the most picturesque areas on the Elbe River with steep cliffs and towering sandstone rock formations. The town of Bad Schandau was developed in the 18th century when health-giving springs were discovered. A large spa and several hotels were built, along with many hiking and walking trails which weave their way thru the hills and forests. A series of rock columns, known as the "Bastei", rise 600 ft. above the river and have been a tourist attraction for over 200 years. A wooden bridge was constructed in 1824, to connect several of these rocks for sightseeing and climbing. It was replaced by a sandstone bridge in 1851 which was dedicated to Carl Heinrich Nicolai, a popular guide, writer, and bungee jumper. A number of people in our party decided to join the crowds







The Bargain Basement begins on May 1, 2021 and will be ongoing. All sales are on a voluntary ba-





## Interesting May Dates in Florida History

May 1, 1562 - Jean Ribault lands at St. Johns and claims Florida for France. Nearly 50 years after Ponce de Leon claimed "La Florida" for the Spanish, along came the French. May 2, 1936 - Panama City Beach is incorporated in Bay County. Panama City Beach incorporated in Bay County - Gideon Thomas built the Panama City Hotel in 1935 and aggressively marketed tourism at a time most locals were only interested in farming.

May 3, 1901 - Jacksonville burns to the ground. It was one of the worst disasters in Florida history and the third largest urban fire in the U.S., next to the Great Chicago Fire, and the 1906 San Francisco fire. Photos of the devastation resemble those of European cities firebombed in World War II.

May 5, 1961 - Alan B. Shepard becomes first American in space. Astronaut Alan B. Shepard becomes first American in space - As remarkable as it was, it scored the U.S. just a silver medal because it came 23 days after a Soviet cosmonaut orbited the Earth. But that embarrassment, combined with the Soviet's launch of the first satellite in 1957, motivated Americans to the moon.

**May 6, 1965 -** Rolling Stones play Clearwater, write "Satisfaction" riff. May 10, 1781 - Spanish Gov. Bernardo de Gálvez captures Pensacola. The surrender following the Spanish land and sea attack left the British with no bases on the Gulf of Mexico, helping the colonists to victory in the American Revolution.

May 13, 1955 - Jax fans chase Elvis after show, tear off his clothes. A group cornered the singer in his dressing room and tore his clothes off in their competition to grab a souvenir. Elvis had to be rescued by police from what has become known as the "first Presley riot."

May 14, 1973 - Skylab launches new era of space study... and toys. Skylab was also celebrated in popular culture and was featured on kids' lunchboxes, a pinball machine, comic books and the TV show, The Six Million Dollar Man.

May 15, 1947 - Florida State College for Women becomes FSU. It was the latest - and last - of a long, crazy series of name changes at the oldest continuous site of higher education in Florida.

May 19, 2004 - Drugstore chain owner Jack Eckerd dies at 91. His name is no longer on the stores, but less than a decade ago, few Floridians could say they'd never shopped in an Eckerd Drug Store.

**May 20, 1913** - Henry Morrison Flagler dies in Palm Beach. Because of Flagler's Florida East Coast Railway, crops could be raised and shipped, building materials could be hauled, and people -- tourists, workers, and residents -- could be shuttled to what was mostly mosquito-ridden scrubland little more than a century ago.

May 22, 1931 - Arcadia company starts selling canned rattlesnake. Yep, "Weird Florida" is not a new idea. We've been weird for decades.

May 23, 1898 - School for Deaf & Blind graduates first students. Two deaf students, Artemas W. Pope and Cora Carlton, would marry and raise a future Florida legislator, Verle A. Pope, known as the Lion of St. Johns. Its most famous alumnus, musician Ray Charles, did not graduate.

May 26, 1845 - Florida holds first statewide election. William Dunn Moseley became the first elected governor and David Levy Yulee won the first race for U.S. House. Yulee did not take his seat and instead was elected one of the state's first two U.S. Senators a short time later

May 28, 1935 - Controversial 'Old Folks at Home' adopted as state song. You know it as "Way Down Upon the Swanee River."




Scientific Name: Polygala smallii; Common Name(s): Tiny polygala, tiny

Habitat: Tiny polygala occurs in four distinct habitats with similar characteristics: pine rockland, scrub, high pine, and open coastal spoil (Gann and Bradley 1995). All of these habitats are



Field Description: Tiny polygala is an erect short-lived herbaceous species. Most plants germinate and die within one year. It forms a rosette and grows no more than 8 cm tall (Kennedy 1998). It has one to four, short, usually unbranched stems, and a well-developed, scented taproot. Its leaves are oblanceolate to lanceolate, from 1.5 to 5 cm long and 0.2 to 1.4 cm broad and occur in a basal rosette. The inflorescence is a cylindric raceme from 0.4 to 7 cm long and

Florida is home to thousands of unique species of plants. A dramatically 0.5 to 1.8 cm thick and usually surpassed by the basal leaves (Kennedy 1998) increasing number of which, are on the verge of extinction. Sometimes, these The flowers have both functional stamens and pistils (perfect) and are not radially symmetrical (zygomorphic). The calyx has five sepals. The lateral pair is decurrent, large and petaloid. The corolla is a greenish-yellow color with three petals. The fruit is a thin-walled, two-celled capsule that splits down the center of the compartment. The seed is 1.2 to 1.4 mm long, with sparse rather short, stiff, appressed hairs.

Polygala smallii is in the family Polygalaceae, commonly referred to as the milkworts. These beautiful, unique plants were once thought to be endemic to Miami-Dade and Broward Counties, but recent surveys have extended its range to southern St. Lucie County. All 11 known populations are found within 9.7 km of the Atlantic Coast.

The tiny milkwort is a short-lived herb. The only known populations occur in sand pockets of pine rocklands, open sand pine scrub, slash pine, high pine, and well-drained coastal spoil. Within these habitats, it requires high light levels and open sand with little to no organic litter accumulation.

The survival and recovery of Polygalasmallii is threatened by habitat loss from urban development, fire suppression, and exotic plant infestation. From what I can gather, the tiny milkwort does not take well to cultivation. The diminutive plant requires occasional burning for survival as the fire and smoke may help its seeds germinate. As most all of the remaining habitats for the tiny milkwort are in highly urbanized areas, targeted, prescribed burns are employed to help the plant survive. This plant is critically imperiled.

What can we do? We can stop littering. Intentional and unintentional littering can collect in scrub, sandhill, and open coastal spoil habitats - where our tiny milkwort makes it's home. Plants can be crushed and "drowned" by the dumping process and accumulated waste.

## **This Old House**

Landmark
Old Cypress Tree

Iris Worth McClain

This Old Cypress Tree still stands tall and proud of it's long history located at 121st Avenue East, behind the Parrish US Postal Office. You may drive by this old cypress tree every day and not know that it is most likely the oldest cypress tree in the Village of Parrish and has a history in the development of our community of Parrish.

The cypress tree was planted at the Oak Hill Plantation home of Bratcher (VanZant) Parrish. As the

Bratcher (VanZant) Parrish. As the story goes, Lamar Parrish's great grandmother took the cypress tree from the woods out east of Parrish, to be planted close to their back porch that held an old hand operated pitcher water pump. Mary planted it by the back porch so it could survive with the water overflow from the pump. As you know, cypress trees love water. When Manatee County paved 121st Avenue E, it was protected from being cut down at the time. Many of the local residence said "No cutting down the Tree!"

Crawford and Mary settled here in 1868, he was born in 1811 in St. Mary's, Georgia. This Parrish family was among some of the first in this area and became known throughout the county as one of the founders of Oak Hill, now Parrish. Crawford was one of the outstanding pioneering families to settle in Florida and Manatee County (re-named due to another town in Florida with the name of Oak Hill).

Crawford met and married Mary Bratcher (VanZant) Parrish in 1841. She was the daughter of a wealthy Hollander who had settled in Nassau County, Fl. The VanZant's made large contributions to Spain's efforts during the War of 1812.

In 1868, the Parrish's purchased the homestead from the widow of Major Iredell Turner, Ida (Turner) Carnes. His property was located along a major north-south cattle trail which became the main highway because of beef cattle trail used to move cattle from one location to another.

This location became the permanent home of the Parrish family for many years. Their neighbors were the Gillett family. Crawford had cattle and orange groves and was a farmer, doing much of it right on this property. Crawford and Mary had nine children. Crawford passed away in 1899, Mary in 1905, both are buried in Fortner Cemetery.

After Crawford and Mary passed away, their youngest son, Garrett VanZant Parrish and his wife Carrie Reid Parrish lived there until Garrett passed away. They had no children. Carrie loved the beach, so she had the old home moved on a barge down the Manatee River to the north end of Anna Maria Island in the early 1900's where it was a Bed and Breakfast for many years. "THIS OLD TREE STILL STANDS VERY TALL AND VERY PROUD" This information was given to me by Lamar Parrish along with much more information about Parrish. I have so enjoyed collecting Parrish history for the past 48 years from many of the people that lived most if not all of their lives right here in Parrish with family and friends.

Iris Worth McClain, moved to Parrish in 1973 with her husband Merle and her two son's Kenny & Larry, coming from Sarasota. After retiring from her banking career of 42 years she became actively involved in the Parrish community with the Parrish Civic Assoc. The Parrish Foundation, Parrish Chili Cook Off, Parrish Arts Council and the Parrish "Y". She coordinates with much help from the local community, the Parrish Children's Christmas Party each year. She wants to provide interesting stories of old homes, buildings and families in and around Parrish to help preserve the history of Parrish.

## **Motivation**

#### John Phillips

In this month's column, I would like to address the issue of motivation. One of the most difficult obstacles to overcome when you are trying to master any skill is, in fact, the issue of motivation.

I would love to tell you that every morning when I wake up, I just cannot wait to grab my guitar and start practicing. Honestly, however, that is not the case. No matter how much we as musicians love our chosen profession, there are days when even we simply do not feel like practicing. So, what are we to do at such a time?

May I suggest three simple, but effective answers to this question. These are based upon my personal experience, as well as conversations with other professional musicians.

First, it is important to set aside a certain time each day which is absolutely dedicated to practicing your instrument. Just as we have certain times of the day where we brush our teeth, take a shower, go to work, have dinner, etc., we should have a certain time in our daily routine which is dedicated to practice. Ideally, this should be much time as possible. Realistically however, we know that we often do not have as much time as we would like. I suggest a minimum of 30 minutes every day if you possibly can.

As Aristotle said, "Excellence is not an act, but a habit." By making practice an essential part of our daily routine we will be more able to fall into the "habit" of practicing and it will be much easier to remain consistent.

Second, I would like to suggest that you occasionally change things up a bit. For example, if you absolutely do not feel like playing, or if you cannot because of an injury, then temporarily change what you are doing during your practice time. For example, pick up the scores of some of the musical pieces which you are working on and analyze them. Read the names of the notes out loud. Count the rhythms. Analyze which chords are being played, where they are being played, and imagine any changes which you would like to make to the piece to make it more enjoyable. Experiment and have fun with it. You may also use this time to listen to or search for different types of music and write down a list of songs which you would like to learn. Adding some variety to your daily practice routine is, in fact, a great motivator.

Third, and this is to be the exception, and not the rule, is that sometimes you just need to take a day off. There, I said it. Some musicians will do this rather sporadically. They will typically practice every day and take a day off as needed. Others will schedule days off into their routine. Six days on, one day off is a common example. A word of caution: taking too much time off is actually a detriment to your motivation and often makes it more difficult to get back into your routine. Allow yourself to relax and enjoy your day off. Afterword, return to your practice refreshed and with renewed vigor.

In conclusion, no matter how much we, as musicians, enjoy what we do, sometimes we can find it difficult to stay motivated. The three things that will help in that regard are as follows: Stay motivated. Always do your best. Never give up.



# **Smoking Can Lead To Eye Problems and Vision Loss**

It is well known how negative of an impact smoking can have on overall health. The direct link between smoking and the development of cancers, cardiovascular disease, and respiratory problems has been well documented. But what effects does smoking have on the eyes?

The most obvious impact of smoking on the eyes is the development of red, irritated eyes. This happens because of 2 different mechanisms. Firstly, smoke from cigarettes, cigars, and pipes is an irritant to the eyes that can cause an allergic reaction to occur. Secondly, smoke can alter the tear film of the eyes, which leads to the development of a dry eye condition. People who already have an underlying dry eye condition notice a worsening of their irritation when exposed to smoke.

Another group of people who are susceptible to an increase in ocular irritation from smoking is those who have thyroid disease, or Grave's Disease. Many of these people suffer from thyroid eye disease, which causes inflammation of the tissues that surround the eyes. This can cause the eyes to bulge forward in some of these patients. Studies have shown that smoking greatly increases the risk of a person with Grave's Disease to also develop thyroid eye disease.

Another condition of the eyes that can be exacerbated by smoking is the formation of cataracts. A cataract is when the natural lens inside the eye becomes cloudy or hazy, reducing the clarity of vision. Smoking decreases the supply of anti-oxidants to the eye, which can lead to cataract development. Smoking has been shown to cause cataracts to be more dense than they are in people who do not smoke. It has also been shown to cause cataracts to occur at a younger age than usual.

The most serious ocular condition that has been linked to smoking is macular degeneration. This is a condition that involves a progressive loss of central vision which can lead to blindness. Current smokers are 4 times more likely to develop macular degeneration than are non-smokers. And people who have smoked in the past are 3 times more likely to develop this condition than are non-smokers.

So we can add the eyes to the list of things that can be adversely affected by smoking. Knowing the facts about the impacts that smoking can have on a person's overall health make it obvious that it is a good idea for any current smoker to make the effort to discontinue this habit. But it is a very difficult thing to do. Luckily, there are many new developments and products available that can help a person to be successful at making this important lifestyle change.

- 2. Having an animal can encourage a more active lifestyle. Playing fetch, tug of war; even walking the dog could become part of a low impact fitness routine the whole family can participate in. Having a pet can stimulate the urge to play, resulting in an increase in physical activity. Kids with pets go outside more often promoting an active lifestyle that can follow them through to adulthood.
- 3. Though smaller children should be monitored around animals, as they get older they can take on more of a leadership role. Exercising the pet, checking food and water levels, cleaning up after them; these examples are some ways a child can participate in "raising" their pet while simultaneously learning about responsibility along the way.
- 4. Children want to take part in caring for their pets; showing keen interest in finding out how to keep them safe and content. That bond helps foster children who are more empathetic towards animals and humans alike. Accountability and positive reinforcement do wonders towards creating more confident, patient, and respectful young people.
- 5. Growing up with a pet acts as an opportunity to teach about miraculous things like reproduction and birth, as well as some of the less pleasant lessons such a death and bereavement.
- 6. Overall, pets make kids happy. Their connection with their pets can increase serotonin, reduce stress levels, and help stave off loneliness. Amiable pet relationships encourage the development of trust. Some children confide in their pets, knowing that their private thoughts and feelings are safe. The unconditional love a pet provides can help a lot if a child is upset.





# Useful Tips when working with a Recruitment Agency

# **Tampa Bay Tarpon Fishing Steels** Spotlight for May! Capt. Jason Prieto

May is yet another great month to fish. You really get to see what Tampa Bay has to offer; from the backcountry and flats all the way into the Gulf of Mexico. It's some of the best all-aroundbest fishing of the year. It's hard to really know what fish to target but Tarpon fishing this month edges out just about any other fish. The Silver King will be running the beaches, passes, bridges and outer flats of Tampa Bay. It's time for some Tarpon fishing.!

Tarpon are one of my favorite fish to put clients on. There is nothing more rewarding than to have clients come all the way across the United States to get the Silver King checked off of their bucket list! Its nice to be the guy to put them on one! It's one of those fish you just have to catch and once you get your first fish boat side you will be hooked. Tarpon are one of the hardest fish to hook and even harder to land. Fifty percent of fish hooked get off because of there acrobatic jumps and freakish power. You will have to do EVERYTHING right to stand a chance to get your trophy in for a picture. I have spent years studying the Silver King and have had the pleasure of working with some of the premier Tarpon guides in the bay over my 16 years of guiding to become an accomplished Tarpon guide. It's not something everybody does and you have to love it and put your time in because it's some of the most advanced inshore fishing Here are a few tips to get you started Tarpon fishing.

Gear is the first thing!. I see so many people fishing the passes and the tackle is typically too small. This is bad for you because you are going to lose most fish you hook and also bad for the fish because you will fight that Tarpon nearly to death. Heavy spinning gear is the best choice for Tampa Bay. I love the Tsunami 5000 reels matched with the 8 foot St Croix tidewater 40l rods, They hold up the the biggest of fish and have plenty of backbone and drag to land the fish. 50 to 65 lb Ohero Braided line matched with 60lb Ohero fluorocarbon leader and a Daiichi 5/0 circle hook. Knots are also VERY important; I like to use a double uni- knot for line to leader and single Uni from leader to hook. You will also add strength with a Spider hitch on you main line. This sounds like a simple rig and it is but always remembers that you are stressing this tackle to its max and sometimes beyond, so you don't have a lot of room for error.

Finding Tarpon is not too hard as they have oxygen bladders and breach the surface periodically to gulp air. This makes it easier than other species to see from a distance and also to read from what direction they are moving. Areas to look this time of year are no big secrets as fish typically run parallel to the beaches and drop off into deeper water on the passes and bridges. Timing is everything and knowing what these fish do around the moon phases will determine you level of success. Knowing where the fish are going versus where they have been will be a great model to base your Tarpon fishing stage. Typically during New and Full Moons are the most productive times as the tides flow is the strongest during these periods of the month. Fishing those strong outgoing tides with pass crabs are of best way to target Tarpon. These pass crabs can be found floating with the outgoing tides on the moon phases mentioned above. Free lined or sometimes using a small split shot to keep the crab down will be a simple but effective way that works. When drifting the passes it is always very important to make sure you make full drifts of the pass The key to Tarpon fishing starts with a good drift. You can't catch fish if you're not on them. Another great idea is to use your bottom finder in the deeper passes to locate fish that are deep. I have become a better Tarpon guide simply from the use of Technology from my Lowrance HDS 12 with the structure scan and side imaging. This lets you see the school and how far out you are from the fish. It's the little things like this that will help you catch more fish.

Beach fishing is another great way to catch tarpon and there is no better thrill then sight casting tarpon on the beach at sunrise. Water depths are typically shallow so using free lined bait or a Cajun Thunder Magnum heavy duty float works great. This is also a great time to use the trolling motor as the shallow water depths tend to make these fish a bit spooky. As mentioned above the technology of today makes things easier and helps us catch more fish. I have become a better Tarpon fisherman thanks to my Rhodan trolling motor and its GPS anchor technology. It enables you to stay with the school easier and keeps the bait in the school. Remember beach fishing has become very popular and with popularity comes boat traffic and lots of fisherman. If we all do things right and respect one another we will all catch more fish. If



you come across someone fishing a school of fish just move to the next or try to work together on that school of fish. We will all win in the end. Best tip I can give you is to book a Tarpon trip with a Tarpon guide. No matter who you hire you will learn more 6 hours than you will learn the entire season on your own Tarpon fishing is not rocket science but knowing the tricks will be what puts fish to the boat. 


